



Changes to behaviour procedures- September 2020

Detentions

Due to our year group bubbles, subject detentions after school or at break or lunch, will not take place. This is to help avoid a situation where students from different bubbles are in the same classroom at the same time. Instead we are encouraging teachers to have more regular communication with parents to discuss issues or concerns regarding a student.

SDfL detentions will take place in year group bubbles. Each bubble will be supervised by a Head of Year/Senior Leadership and a member of staff.

Our shared expectations of a King's Norton boy

In the classroom:

- A King's Norton boy will sanitise his hands when entering a classroom.
- A King's Norton boy will settle quickly at the beginning of the lesson, in the seat allocated to him by his teacher. He will respect the working space and belongings of those around him, adhering to social distancing.
- A King's Norton boy will not get out of his seat unless the teacher gives him permission.
- A King's Norton boy will avoid turning around to talk to other students and faces the front of the classroom, unless directed to do otherwise by the teacher.

Uniform standards:

- A King's Norton boy wears his uniform in the correct way. On days when he has PE, he will wear his PE kit to school as outlined in the adapted uniform expectations.
- A King's Norton boy, if he wishes, may wear a face mask. This should be either a 'surgical-type' or a plain fabric mask. Scarf-type masks are not to be worn. Masks must be worn correctly, covering both his nose and mouth. A King's Norton boy will remove his mask, if requested to do so by a member of staff, to aid communication.

Around school:

- A King's Norton boy will sanitise his hands when arriving at school and before eating.
- A King's Norton boy will follow the one-way system when moving around school, he will move around sensibly, respecting the space of students around him.
- A King's Norton boy will not mix with other year group bubbles and will adhere to social distancing if he does encounter someone from a different bubble.
- A King's Norton boy will respect the personal space of all staff and will adhere to social distancing.
- A King's Norton boy will return to his lesson at the end of break and lunch immediately. He will ensure he allows time to use the one-way system.

Management of behaviour:

- A King's Norton boy has high personal expectations of himself and respects the need to keep himself safe, he also behaves in a way which will keep those around him safe, including adhering to social distancing.
- A King's Norton boy is good at reflecting on any behaviour which does not meet our new expectations and will accept the consequences without argument.
